

The time surrounding the death of a loved one is always a difficult one, and the local vicar is there to help to support you through this time and help you plan the funeral so that it is a very personal event, whether or not you have any association with the church.

Anyone resident in the parish, or who worships with us regularly in the parish is entitled to have a funeral in one of our churches, or taken by the vicar at a crematorium or at the graveside. They are also entitled to be buried in the churchyard, or have their ashes interred there. Your funeral director will liaise with the vicar to arrange a mutually convenient date and time.

A parish funeral also means that there is on-going pastoral support for the bereaved, should they wish it, and the bereaved can be confident that they will be met with sympathy and compassion.
