Transposed up a tone, and note values halved. The words are from 'Lydney's Praiers', which form a section of Henry Bull's Christian Praiers and Holy Meditacions, 1568. This anthem has been attributed to Richard Farrant, but his name was never associated with it till late in the 18th century. The earlier MSS agree in ascribing it to the elder John Hilton, of Trinity College, Cambridge, and there is no good reason to doubt that he was the composer. The contrapuntal Amen which has sometimes been printed at the conclusion, is not found in any text older than the beginning of the 18th century; it was probably first composed and added at about that date.
