

BLEDLLOW 100 CLUB – PRIVACY NOTICE

In conformity with the data protection regulations, we would like Bledlow 100 Club members to note the following about your personal data:

What we need

The Bledlow 100 Club is the ‘Controller’ of the personal data you provide to us. We collect the following personal data about you: your name, address, email, phone number, bank account details (where given) and confirmation that you are over 16.

Why we need it and basis for processing

We need to collect this information to be able us to enrol you into the Club and to contact you in case you have won a prize or if any other Club-related matters need to be discussed. For transparency, we also need to disclose the names of the winners of each quarterly draw at the time of the draw and on our website. We will not collect any personal data from you we do not need in order to run the Club in accordance with its rules. The legal bases on which we process data are for the performance of a contract between you and the Club and to comply with our legal obligations. In the case of information processed for marketing purposes, this is done on the basis of your consent (see below “*What we would also like to do with it*”).

What we do with it

All the personal data we process is processed by me as Promoter or by the Club Secretary or by third parties at our request. All the data is kept in the hard copy application forms, scanned application forms and in Excel spreadsheets that I or the Club Secretary keep on our computers. The data is kept in the UK (or backed up on servers in the EU) and no third parties will have access, unless there is a legal requirement to disclose it. Our computers are password protected and we keep application forms at our houses which are the subject of appropriate security measures.

How long we keep it

We keep the information for as long as you remain a member, and for a period of 6 years after you leave. 6 years is typically the limitation period for claims or for tax investigations.

What we would also like to do with it

In addition to contacting you each year to ask if you wish to renew your membership, we may from time to time approach former Club members asking them if they wish to re-join. If any former member wishes not to be contacted, please let me know.

What are your rights?

If at any point you believe the information we process about you is incorrect, you may request to see this information and have it corrected or (if it is no longer needed) deleted. If you wish to raise a complaint on how we have handled your personal data, you can contact me. If you are not satisfied with our response or believe we are not processing your personal data in accordance with the law, you can complain to the Information Commissioner’s Office (ICO).
